A no touch technique is recommended. If skin contact occurs, wash with soap and water. Acrylates may penetrate commonly utilized gloves. If product contacts glove, remove and discard glove, wash hands immediately and then reglove.

Ventillation Protection: Do not use in a confined area or areas with limited air movement. Use in a well-ventilated area.

Respritory Protection: Avoid prolonged breathing of vapors. Avoid breathing of dust created by cuting, sanding, grinding or machining cured product.

Prevention of Accidental Ingestion: Do not eat, drink, or smoke when utilizing this product. Wash exposed areas thoroughly with soap and water. Wash hands between handling and eating. Do not ingest.

Recommended Storage: Store in a cool place away from acids, heat, and light. Fire and Explosion Avoidance: Keep conatiner tightly closed. Flamable liquid and vapor.
